Explore BunGeo

There is so much to do in Bunbury Geographe with heaps of playgrounds, cycle tracks, natural attractions, and animal encounters.

DAY ONE: PERTH TO BUNBURY

The Crooked Carrot is a great place to stop on your way to Bunbury, it has great food and coffee and a play area for kids (and dogs). Once you arrive in Bunbury, we recommend spending a few hours exploring the Koombana Bay waterfront precinct. The bay is usually calm and a safe swimming spot for families. There is also a great playground, a splash park within the Discovery Parks precinct and the new Koolambidi Woola Youth Precinct. The kids will love all the activities. The waterfront precinct is also a great place to find dinner.

DAY TWO: DOLPHINS AND ART

Start the day with a guick breakfast, La Pause Miam does great pancakes and Benesse has lots of yummy options. Bunbury is famous for the wild dolphins that live in Koombana Bay and regularly visit the beach and interact with visitors. A daily dolphin swim or eco cruise leaves from in front of the Dolphin Discovery Centre at 8am and is a must-do experience (booking is essential). When you come back, explore the exhibits at the Discovery Centre before heading along the waterfront for lunch and a sweet treat at Taffy's. Spend the afternoon exploring Bunbury and the mural trail. You can walk or why not hire a bike or e-scooter to add another fun element to the tour. You can collect the brochure from the visitor centre. Stop in at Guardians of Happiness for afternoon tea. Spend some time at Koolambidi Woola before getting some fish and chips and watching the sunset at Back Beach.

DAY THREE: GOING WILD


Take the time to have a leisurely breakfast. The Happy Wife on Austral Parade is a great option with fabulous views over the water. Spend the morning at the Bunbury Wildlife Park. You can meet lots of local native animals including kangaroos, dingos, quokkas and a wombat. There is a great accessible playground outside the wildlife park. Have morning tea at Coffee and Flour before heading out to the Ferguson Valley. Gnomesville is a must-visit where thousands of wild gnomes live, vou can even leave your own anome there. Head to Wild Bull or Bush Shack Brewery for a hearty lunch. St Aidan Wines is just a minute up the road if you want to sample some local wines before heading home.


